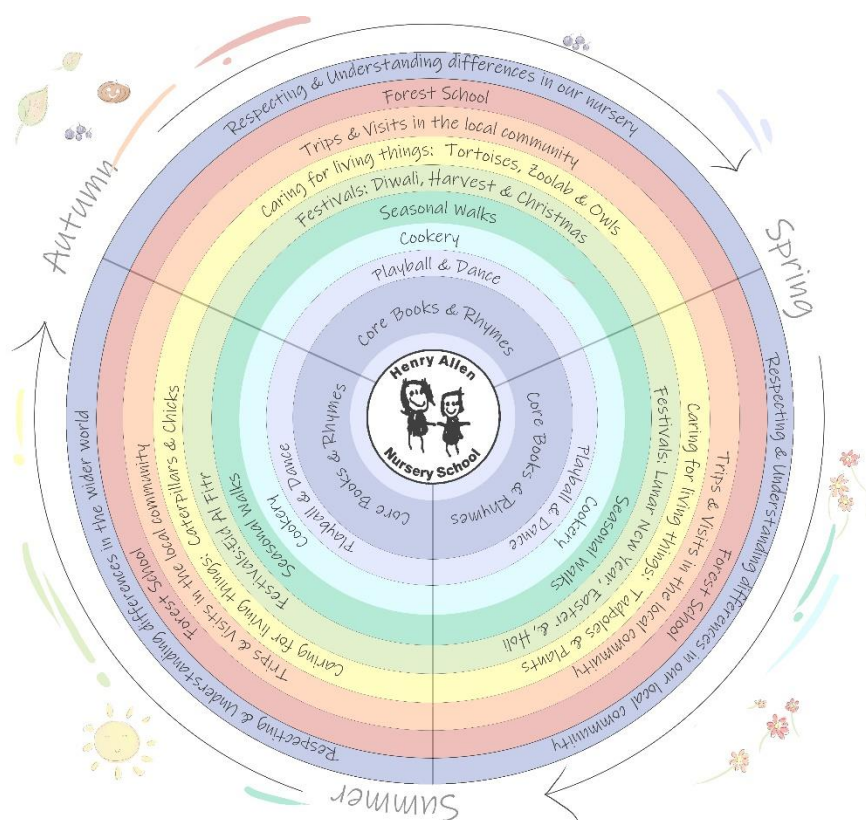
Local Learning Area Procedure



General

“The locality around school harbours a wealth of opportunities within walking distance. Learners can develop the skills to explore their local environment. This can enrich all areas of the curriculum, for example through land and streetscapes, sites of special scientific interest, heritage sites, places of worship, theatres, live music events and involvement through citizenship activities like local volunteering projects.”

Core experiences are evidenced in the above wheel, which highlight our opportunities for exploration, awe and wonder. Regular visits within the local area, and opportunities to invite visitors into our setting, enhance the children’s opportunity to learn about and become active members of the community of Amersham. It may involve trips to the library, local

park, shops, restaurants, care homes and places of worship. The trips take place during normal school hours follow the Operating Procedure outlined below.

These visits/activities:

- do not require parental consent
- do not normally need additional risk assessments / notes (other than following the Operating Procedure below).
- Must be recorded on Evolve under Local Visit category

They stay with us into adulthood and affect our behaviour, lifestyle and work. They influence our values and the decisions we make. 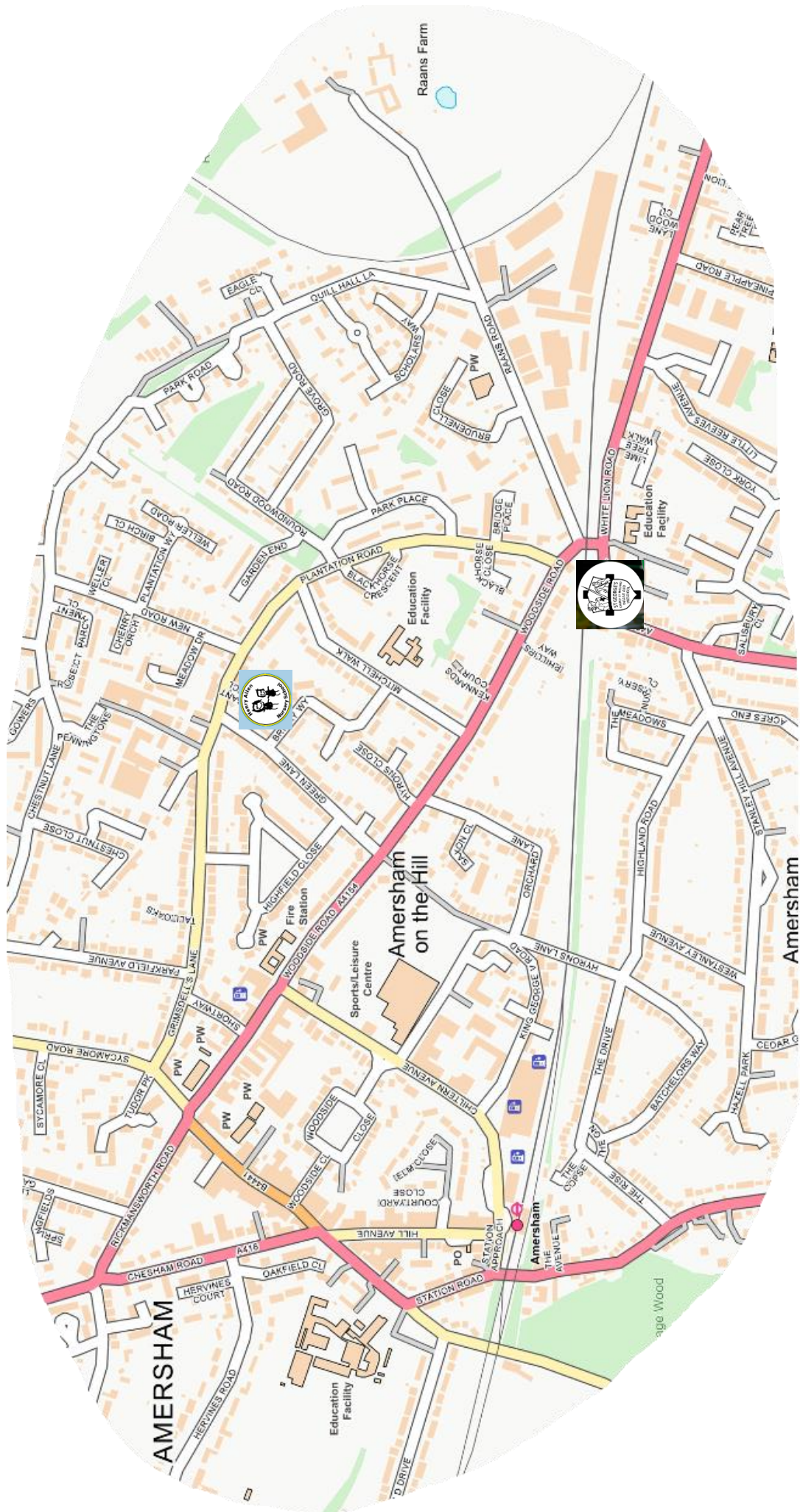
Boundaries

The boundaries of the Local Learning Area are shown on the attached map of Amersham. This area includes, but is not limited to, the following frequently used venues:

- *St Georges’s School*
- *Amersham Station*
- *Raans Farm and woods behind*
- *Local Library in the Chiltern Lifestyle Centre*
- *The soft play Lifestyle centre and local park nearby*
- *Amersham High street shops and Tuesday market*
- *The Fire station in Amersham*
- *Local places of worship e.g. King’s Church*
- *Local care homes*
- *Local cafes and tea rooms*

Operating Procedure for Local Learning Area

The following are potentially significant issues/hazards within our Local Learning Area:

- Road traffic
- Other people / members of the public / animals
- Losing a pupil
- Uneven surfaces (→ slips, trips and falls)
- Weather conditions
- Activity-specific issues when doing fieldwork (nettles, brambles, rubbish, etc.)

These are managed by a combination of the following:

- The Co-Headteacher, (Mrs Manning or Mrs Macdonald) or EVC, Mrs Turner, must give verbal and written approval (on the Evolve Website) before a group leaves.
- The trip must be recorded on Evolve as a local Area Visit.
- The staff who are approved by the Co-headteachers to lead off-site visits in our LLA are listed in Appendix 1.
- When their child joins the Nursery, the concept and Operating Procedure of the 'Nursery Learning Area' is explained to all parents. There is a synopsis is in the on the Nursery website. All children will give consent for trips to the LLA when joining the Nursery, see Appendix 3, agreement to trips in the LLA.
- There will normally be a minimum of two adults and a ratio of 1:5 adults: children with the three/four-year olds.

However, the number of adults may be greater than this as determined by the group risk assessment for the specific class in order to provide effective supervision. There will always be an adult with paediatric first aid training.

- Staff are familiar with the area and risk assessment and as an outcome know what to do.
- Staff know the emergency procedures, lost child procedure and have practised appropriate group management techniques.

- Children have been trained and have practised standard techniques for road crossings in a group.
- Where appropriate, children are fully briefed on what to do if they become separated from the group appropriate to their age. We will follow the lost child procedure.
- Children's clothing and footwear is checked for appropriateness prior to leaving Nursery.
- Staff are aware of any relevant child medical information and ensure that any required medication is available.
- Staff will deposit in the office a list of all pupils and staff/adults, a proposed route, and an estimated time of return.
- A designated Emergency Contact 'back at base', who is aware of the proposed visit/activities, will have been identified beforehand and ensure that they remain contactable until notified of the group's safe return.
- The school mobile is taken and the office will have a note of the number.
- Staff take a designated emergency bag with them containing first aid kit, small eye wash, laminated Serious Incident Action Card, space blanket etc.
- Appropriate personal protective equipment is taken when needed (e.g. gloves, goggles).
- Training will be carried out with staff and children ahead of visiting the LLA. Traffic precautions will be taken for crossing roads as we exit and enter the Nursery building. All children will be made aware of traffic safety, and will practise road safety within Nursery.
- All staff will receive training on the LLA and this will be added to staff induction.
- Information on the LLA will be found on our website.
- LLA consent forms will be added to welcome packs for all children joining nursery and will be completed when children join. (Appendix 2)
